Read the passage carefully and the answer the questions that follow.

Obesity among children in India is on the rise. Nearly half of India's adolescent population is overweight and at high risk for various dangerous diseases, including diabetes. Proper nutrition is essential for growth and development. Your diet must include fruits and vegetables, whole grains, legumes, dairy products, eggs, lean meat, and nuts. Certain foods, on the other hand, are best avoided. Junk food refers to high-calorie and low-nutrient food items. Examples are deep-fried foods such as burgers, samosas, cakes, chips, and colas. Besides being high in calories, these also tend to contain excess sugar, salt, and saturated fats that increase the risk of obesity and heart problems in adult life. While it may be difficult to completely exclude

these from your diet, try substituting them with healthy choices. For example, a pizza made with whole wheat crust, loaded with veggies and low-fat cheese is a better option than a store-bought pizza. Substitute whole wheat rotis for 'naans'; instead of bhelpuri made with sev, serve a fruit or vegetable salad with chat masala.
